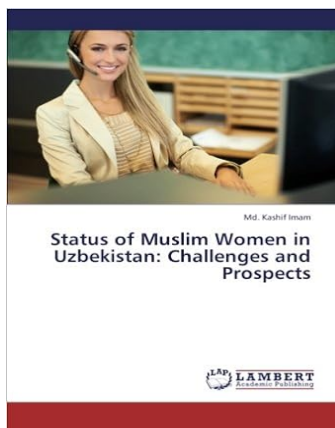

The disintegration of the Soviet Union and subsequent independence of the Central Asian republics brought many potential changes in the region of which Islamic revivalism and market economy are significant as these changes have direct repercussion on the people's life. Uzbekistan's post-Soviet development, like that in most of the former Soviet Union, has entailed enormous and disproportionate obstacles to women's realization of their human rights.
